

Impact of Sports Funding 2015/2016

Gymnastics

A specialist gymnastic teacher observed all staff teaching gymnastics in the Autumn term 2016 in order to ensure standards were being maintained following a 2 year CPD programme funded by Sports Premium. All staff commented on the fact that the level of challenge set for pupils by the Specialist Teacher throughout the CPD support was very high. The focus for observations in the Autumn 2015 term was 'level of challenge' of all children. All lessons observed were good, with one graded as outstanding.

Netball and Athletics

In the summer term, CPD was provided for Yr 3 / 4 teaching staff in athletics and for Yr 5 /6 teaching staff for netball. This was provided by a specialist P.E. teacher. Feedback from staff was extremely positive and a bank of planning activities as well as further team teaching support in 2017 should ensure that improvement in teaching is sustained.

Intra-School Sport Competition.

All children have been allocated to one of four houses: Ennis, Hamilton, Cooper and Beckham. In the summer term, every year competed in their house teams to complete a challenging but extremely enjoyable half day or full day training and competition session. This was led by a Specialist P.E. teacher. Hamilton House were the champions. The feedback from staff and children alike was outstanding and the level of skill for many children, commendable. Detailed assessments were made of children in order to fine tune athletics provision for the following year when two full intra school competitions will be held in the spring and summer terms.

Swimming

Year 3 to 6 children swim each year in the Summer term, using the pool at our neighbouring secondary school. Over the previous 2 years, CPD has been allocated to staff so that they were better able to support intermediate and beginner swimmers. Observations in Summer 2016, show that staff confidence is strong now when teaching swimmers and many pupils achieved an ASA award at the end of the Summer Term.

Detailed swimming assessments show that all children made good progress from their starting points.

Football for EYFS for the Third Year

We have used Sports Funding to employ JB Sports who have worked with the youngest children in school on the First Kick programme. This has taken place over the Spring and Summer Term. 45 places were taken up by this cohort. Feedback from these children has been extremely positive and many of them have said they will continue with football in Yr 1.

This means we have two cohorts of children in school who have had specialist training in football so equipping them well for success in Games activities as well as educating the youngest children in the school in the importance of keeping active and healthy.

Inter School Sports Competition

In the 2015/2016 academic year the School took part in an inter schools' competition organised by JB sports as well as a range of other competitions and events.
